

Fernando's Fun-tastic Friends



"We'll play sports and games," said Andrew, "and make sure everyone is fit and having fun!"


Fernando was not a fan. "That doesn't sound like much fun to me."

"We could go five-pin bowling," offered Andrew.






Fernando's answer was always the same. "No, no, no."
